Declaration of Independence from School (maximum 80 points)



When the American colonists declared independence from the King of England, they listed all of the reasons why they wanted to start a new government. These ideas included all of the ideas from the Enlightenment such as: Divine Right, Social Contract, Freedom of Speech, Natural Rights, Separation of Powers, and Tyranny. Your declaration of independence from school should include a version of all of these reasons, stating how these rights are violated. All 6 vocabulary words should be used in the declaration.

- *How can we show creatively reasons for the Revolution or themes
- *A catch-phrase or slogan.
- *A "celebrity" endorsement from a famous Enlightenment thinker or Revolutionary (Doesn't have to be their own words exactly, but should be something that they would have said.)
